# REMINDER - Vaccination Clinic dates for this week

#### For immediate release

(Kahnawake – 4, Tsothohrhkó:wa/January 2022 at 9:30am) The Kateri Memorial Hospital Centre and Public Safety Commission wish to remind the community that Vaccination Clinics for COVID-19 vaccines will be held at the Knights of Columbus Hall on the following dates:

- Wednesday, January 5 9am to 4:30pm
- Friday, January 7 **9am to 4:30pm**
- Saturday, January 8 9am to 4:30pm

This Vaccination Clinic is open to those 18 years and older for first, second dose or booster.

You can book your appointment as of <u>today</u> (January 4, 2022) at 1pm by clicking <u>here</u>.

**Please note**, due to the current situation in the community, and a shortage of healthcare staff, Vaccination Clinics will only be announced on a week-by-week basis.

<u>Important Information</u>: If you have had COVID-19, schedule your appointment **8 weeks** after the beginning of your symptoms or a **positive COVID-19 test**.

It is also recommended that anyone under the age of 29 should receive the Pfizer vaccine as a booster/3<sup>rd</sup> dose, no matter which vaccine they received as their first or second dose, to reduce the risk of myocarditis and pericarditis.

With the number of confirmed COVID-19 variant (Delta and Omicron) cases on the rise around the world, it is recommended to get your booster or 3<sup>rd</sup> dose to enhance vaccine efficacy.
