Important: Due to the current situation of high COVID-19 outbreaks amongst youth, there will be 25 extra doses available for 16 and 17-year-olds next Thursday and Friday BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. We strongly urge all 16 and 17-year-olds to book an appointment to be vaccinated at this time due to the increase in cases and current high transmission throughout the community.

<u>Please note</u>: There are now seventeen (17) active cases of COVID-19 within the Territory. The majority of transmission is amongst the population under 20 years of age. Direct conversation within the family should not be overlooked as an effective means of providing important information to this increasingly vulnerable age group.
