Request for Decision/Mohawk Council Executive Directive: Purchase and Designation of Lot 168 Block F

Attending: John Bud Morris, Kyle Delisle (Tewatohnhi'saktha), Melanie Gilbert, Martin Stacey, David Lahache. Unanimous formal approval of previously-announced purchase by Tewatohnhi'saktha of Lot 168 Block F, located at junction of Highway 207 and Highway 30, and its designation "for commercial purposes." The reason for the purchase is to provide access to the western portion of the lands being returned to Kahnawà:ke along Highway 30. The land, which comprises seventeen acres in total, is designated for the exclusive use of Tewatohnhi'saktha for economic development purposes and commercial activities.
