CIF Pleased to Launch Round Three

For Immediate Release

(Kahnawake – 25, Onerahtohkó:wa/May 2020) The Community Initiatives Fund is pleased to announce that Round 3 has now officially been launched, with two new gardening initiatives recently deemed essential by the Kahnawake COVID-19 Task Force.

Kahnawake's Collective Impact (KCI) Food Sovereignty initiative has been approved to receive \$130,967 to implement their project, which involves the establishment of multiple three-sisters family gardens at the homes of Kahnawake residents. Helmed by Trisha Delormier, of KCI, the initiative is largely driven by community member Randy Cross and the food sovereignty action team, who will soon launch a registration system for community members to apply to host a garden. The initiative also includes the planting of one large community garden, which will be located along the OCR.

In addition, the First Nations Regional Adult Education Center will receive \$58,600 for their FNRAEC 2020 Gardening Initiative, which also includes the creation and adaptation of home vegetable gardens in the community. The Gardening Initiative team, led by Kanerahtiio Hemlock, will create gardens, or till and modify existing gardens, for as many people as they can handle, while also planting and maintaining the present community garden on Highway 30.

Both initiatives are funded by the CIF, with a 50% financial contribution from Kahnawake Shakotiia'takehnhas Community Services.

The CIF application deadline for Round 3 was January 24, 2020, and the review and selection process was already underway but forced to halt due to coronavirus restrictions. As a result, 9 other initiatives have been approved and will receive funding, but only when the Task Force lifts further restrictions.
