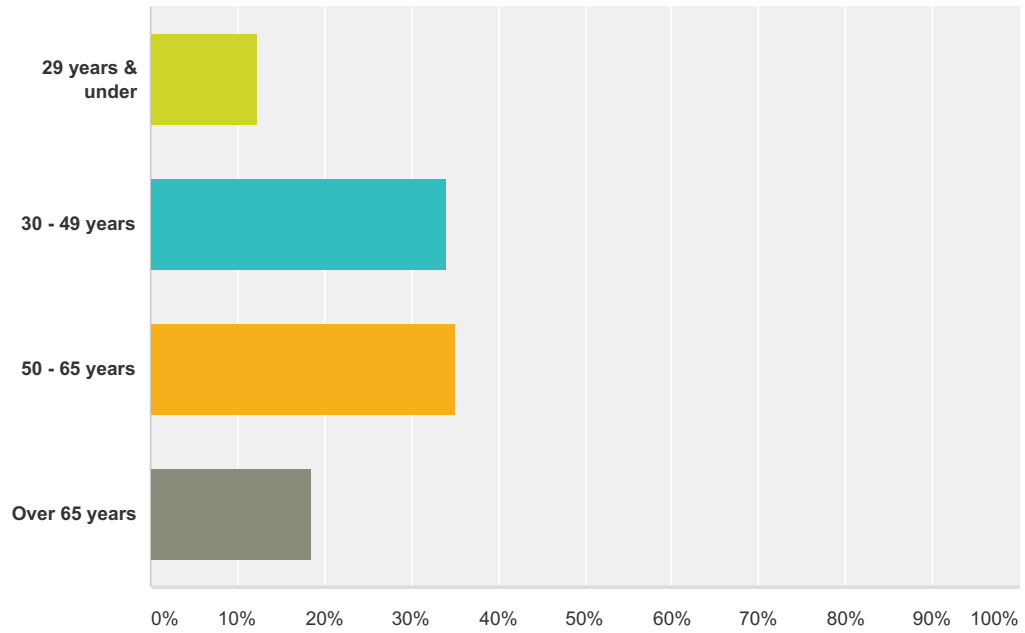

### Q11 Age

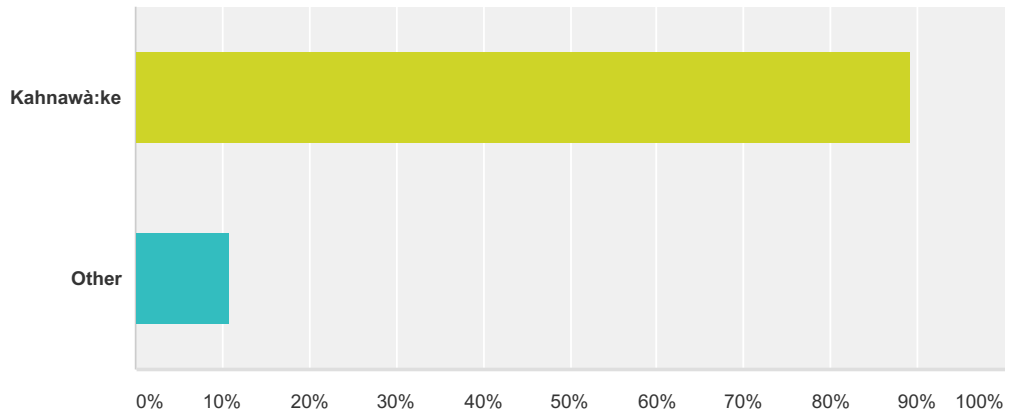

### Q12 Where do you plan to be buried?

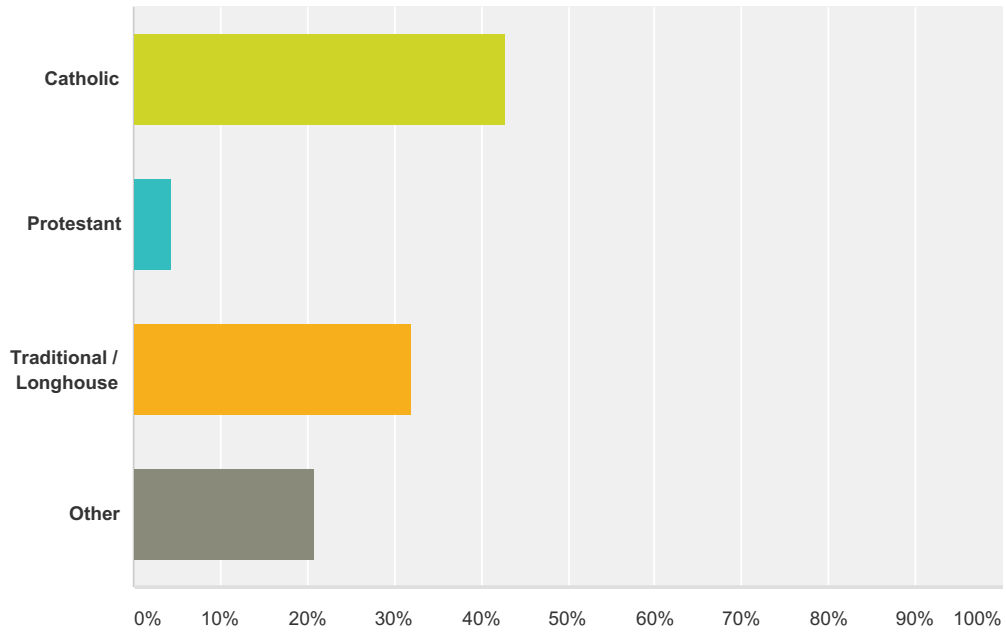
